Pam Najdowski is an independent researcher and owner of Textile Treasures, which specializes in vintage Chinese children's hats, new quilts, old quilts, baby carriers, and smaller textiles and fragments from the Chinese minority.

This talk and slide show will take you on an exploration into Guizhou and Guangxi Province, where Pam went to seek out the sources and origins of applique quilts of the Zhuang, Bouyei, and Miao people who are considered ethnic minorities. Their traditional handworked textiles are extremely elaborate, highly skilled and unique to the mountainous provinces of southwestern China. The People's Republic of China officially recognizes 56 nationalities, which make up its population. Only 10% is considered minority nationalities. Many of the quilts she obtained on her adventures are now in the Quilts of the Southwest China exhibit at the Museum of International Folk Art. This trunk show will be extensive with many beautiful textiles to see and purchase.

Pam is committed to providing a market for these skilled crafts people to ensure the survival and the continuation of their traditional handicrafts in a rapidly changing world.

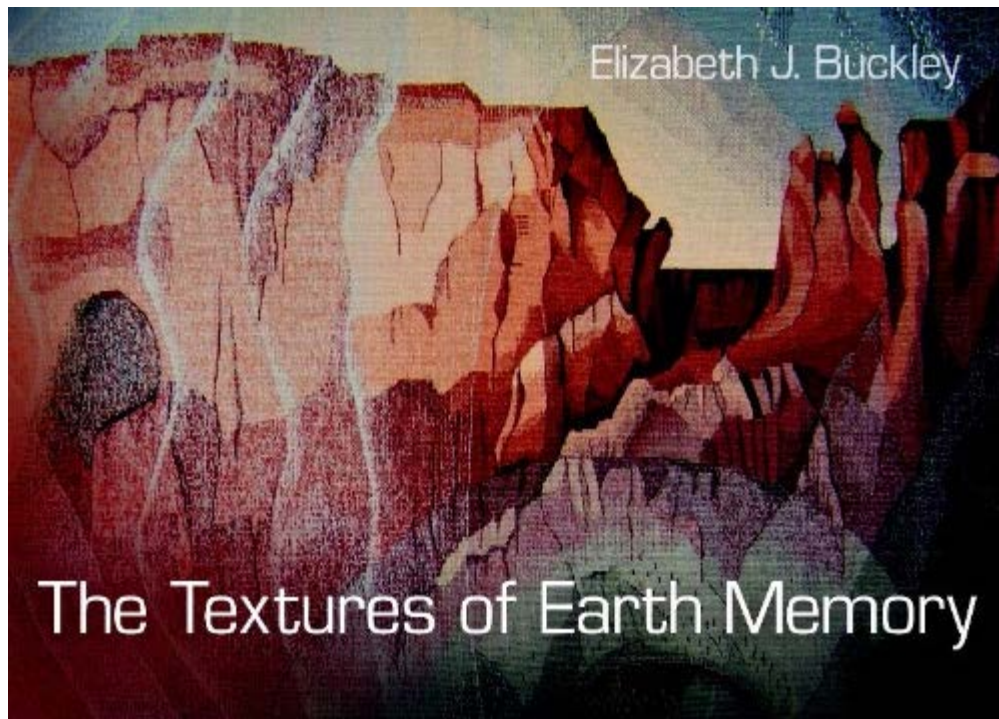

Description:

This solo exhibition focuses on the deep, geologic memory of the Earth, as revealed in Open Space. In wild and undisturbed spaces one can sense the presence of millennia that stretch beyond the human lifetime. Through drawings and hand woven French tapestries, Elizabeth Buckley offers a glimpse into the realm of geologic, mythic, and temporal memory. Her works take the viewer back in time to European history and art, to the petroglyphs along the escarpment of Albuquerque, and then to her present-day interpretations.
